# Congo Basin

One of the biggest obstacles Bible translators face in the Congo Basin is a lack of infrastructure. Translators must allow ample time for travel because roads can be hazardous. In addition, due to rebel activity in three of the region's four countries, translation teams and even whole language communities have been displaced. Many people in this region have been through severe trauma, but God's Word in their own languages can help bring healing to both their hearts and minds.

We join the Seed Company field team in praying this Scripture for protection over Bible translators in the Congo Basin: "The nations are in chaos, and their kingdoms crumble! God's voice thunders, and the earth melts! The Lord of Heaven's Armies is here among us; the God of Israel is our fortress."

Even in the midst of these serious challenges, we praise God for the committed partners who continue to invest their resources and expertise into this region as they count down to Zero languages without God's Word in their countries.



## Regional Praise

### Bringing Unity in Democratic Republic of Congo

One of the main goals of Wycliffe Congo\*, a new Bible translation organization in Democratic Republic of Congo, is to unify the other 10–12 organizations in the country working in Bible translation. This is fantastic! With cooperation and communication, we can make sure we're all working side-by-side, sharing resources, and not wasting or duplicating effort.

Wycliffe Congo and <u>Faith Comes by Hearing</u> have planned a meeting June 19–22 in the capital city of Kinshasa about <u>Oral Bible Translation</u>— specifically exploring its exciting potential to reach people with God's Word in a country where the literacy rate is relatively low.

## **Urgent Need!**

### Pray for the Havu People in Democratic Republic of Congo

Before Bible translation started in their language in 2018, most Havu people struggled to understand pastors' messages in Swahili—even though about 60% of them identified as Christian. Today, they have access to Luke's Gospel and the "JESUS" film in Havu and are working on more New Testament books.

Less than 2 weeks ago, their community was devastated by flooding and mudslides. More than 400 people were killed, and thousands of homes were destroyed. Many more people have sustained serious injuries. Lead translator Olivier visited the villages that were affected and discovered that one translation team member had lost more than 50 members of his extended family.

### PRAY FOR BIBLELESS PEOPLE GROUPS

### Ngiri Cluster in Democratic Republic of Congo

Sometimes in Bible translation, it can be difficult to know when all the people in a region truly have access to God's Word in a way they can understand. Thankfully, in the case of this project, a language survey was recently conducted to find all the dialects in this particular area along the Ngiri River. The Ngiri <u>Cluster project</u> will begin Bible translation for all 11 of these people groups.


As with most Bible translators in Democratic Republic of Congo, these teams will face logistical challenges. This is a rainforest area, and the distance between these villages and the main provincial town takes at least a day or more by canoe.

#### **PRAY**

• That this project gets approved in time to begin in July.

#### **PRAISE**

- All these people groups expressed interest in having oral Bible stories in their languages.
- Seed Company will work with a trusted and experienced partner on this project.



# Pray for Protection from a Rebel Group in Democratic Republic of Congo

Many people groups in the North Kivu province of Democratic Republic of Congo profess Christianity, but ancestor worship is still common. Bible translators are working to help them gain a better understanding of God, but conditions here are challenging. A rebel group called M23 has been actively attacking villages in this province for many months and even years prior.

### **Pray Now**

Ask God to provide for translation teams, as M23 rebels are cutting off access to large cities. Ask for wisdom as believers minister to refugees who have been forced from their homes.

#### **PRAY FOR PARTNERS**

### ACATBA (Central African Association for Bible Translation and Literacy)

Around 74% of the six million people in the Central African Republic are Christians, but many still lack Scripture in their own language. Only about half of them can read and write. <u>ACATBA</u> (Central African Association for Bible Translation and Literacy) has been addressing these needs since 1993.

ACATBA is currently finishing several New Testaments and beginning translation in eight new languages! Three finance staff just finished their internships. Two ACATBA translators who are already experts in Scripture interpretation are working toward certification as translation consultants.

### **HOW TO PRAY**

- Our ACATBA brothers and sisters are praying for God to send someone to serve as a literacy specialist.
- Some key people have retired recently, so ACATBA requests prayer for the new staff as they learn and apply new skills.
- Pray for the translation teams for these eight languages to get off to a good start.



### Pray for a Partner's Transportation Challenges in Democratic Republic of Congo

Local organization <u>CET</u> works alongside Faith Comes By Hearing, American Bible Society, and Seed Company to reach 30 communities with Scripture. In their area, roads are often nonexistent or impassable, and internet and telephone service are unreliable. Flights are often canceled at the last minute.

Thankfully, the many rivers that wind through the region provide a more reliable mode of transportation. However, CET currently only owns motorized dugout canoes, requiring them to travel 4–5 days under the hot sun to reach certain language areas.

### PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT

### Dolisie Cluster in Republic of Congo: God's Word Is Unstoppable

The five language teams of the Dolisie Cluster, which we celebrated and prayed for in September, learned to craft and share many Bible stories over 2 ½ years. They spread God's Word in churches, homes, fields, and listening groups.

Out of around 325,000 people who speak these languages, approximately 7,000 have now heard at least one Scripture story, and 500 currently participate in 43 weekly Bible storytelling groups.

#### **PRAISE**

- Before judging a difficult situation amongst his people, one Kaamba village chief often asks the Bible storytellers for an example from Scripture to guide him. He then tells that story to the people before rendering his decision.
- Local people report that increased knowledge of God's Word in the Bisi language is strengthening marriages and reducing divorce in their communities.

#### PRAY

- That the truth of God's Word will help build healthy churches and strong believers in this area.
- That storytelling groups will continue to grow and multiply.

"Rev. Anzetaka is a big ol' teddy bear," say those who know him. He's a jovial man who loves telling a good story. But he's also a masterful teacher who overflows with linguistic and cultural observations from the surrounding people groups.

He told a story about the first time he met an elderly Hema man in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo. Elderly Hema people don't shake hands; they stoop, and the other person touches their right shoulder in greeting. But Rev. Anzetaka didn't know this. So when this elderly Hema man stooped forward, Rev. Anzetaka stooped forward too because he thought the man was wanting to whisper something in his ear! Thankfully, he always keeps the mission in view and is able to laugh good-naturedly about awkward moments.

#### **PRAY**

- For healing from inflammation in Rev. Anzetaka's right heel
- For provision for his son's wedding preparations.
- For his daughter and son-in-law who long for a child.
- For peace in certain areas where civil unrest has hindered Rev. Anzetaka's travels.

### God's Word Brings Unity in the Congo


