# Anglophone West Africa

"Anglophone" refers to the countries where English is accepted as a main language or language of commerce. This week, we're praying for the anglophone West African nations of Nigeria, Ghana, Liberia, Sierra Leone, and The Gambia.

This region's numerous translation partners work well with each other using a variety of translation methods, including written, audio, sign language, video, Oral Bible Storytelling, and trauma healing workshops. Bible translation organizations seek to partner with churches in Nigeria (the country with the 3rd-highest remaining Bible translation needs in the world) in ways that promote local ownership of translation work.

In order to reach the day when Zero languages in this region are without Scripture, prayer is needed for God's people to withstand persecution, infrastructure to improve, righteousness to replace corruption, the true gospel to replace false teaching, and well-trained, committed people to work in Bible translation. Together, we pray Hebrews 10:23 over the region: "Let us hold tightly without wavering to the hope we affirm, for God can be trusted to keep his promise."

## Regional Praise

#### God Answers Prayers for Nigerian Currency Shortage

In February, the change in Nigeria's currency caused hardships for many local and regional partners in Bible translation. Most businesses wouldn't take old notes, and ATMs weren't giving out new ones. Many Nigerians, dependent on cash, couldn't buy food and other necessities. Electronic payments also weren't working, making it difficult for translation project staff to get paid.

After the general elections, the "powers that be" reversed the policy and allowed use of the old notes. No one is sure how, but somehow, the old notes surfaced again—in abundance. This is an answer to our prayers in March!

For continued provision for everyone working in Bible translation in Nigeria and that God will help their projects get back on track.

#### PRAY FOR A BIBLELESS PEOPLE GROUP

#### Ojah Community of Nigeria

The Ojah (pronounced "or-jah") community, along with many other Bibleless people groups, is found in Southern Nigeria's <u>Edo State</u>.

A local partner called Mission for Language Translation was already working with the neighboring <u>Ososo community</u> to translate Scripture, which paved the way to build relationships with Ojah people. They've now included the Ojah people in a <u>cluster project</u> with two other language communities, and they aim to produce a written and audio New Testament within three years!

#### **PRAISE**

The Ojah people initiated these conversations with Mission for Language Translation, demonstrating their passion and commitment. The project manager writes, "People are so ready for God's Word in their language!"

For this exciting opportunity to bring Scripture to the Ojah people by the end of May 2026!



# Pray for Flooding Recovery in Southern and Southeastern Nigeria

Annual seasonal flooding earlier this year has had long-lasting effects. Due in part to the currency instability, cleanup and recovery have taken longer than usual. Some Bible translation team members lost loved ones in the disaster. Others experienced loss of property, including homes and translation equipment such as laptops.

#### **PRAY FOR PARTNERS**

#### Mission for Language Translation in Nigeria

<u>Mission for Language Translation</u>, an organization led by Dr. Chinedu Anya, is accelerating Scripture translation in Nigeria using a 3-year written New Testament project design. Their "blitz" strategy brings translation experts and local community reviewers together at workshops for "all hands on deck" Scripture checking.

At last count, they were mentoring and training over 42 interns in the world of Scripture translation. Underneath all their work lies a foundation of prayer for the Lord to raise up the right people to translate God's Word for all of Nigeria and West Africa.

#### **PRAY**

- That the financial difficulties caused by the currency issue will continue to diminish so teams can resume travel and work.
- For God's wisdom as Mission for Language Translation continues to pour into those called to take part in Scripture translation.



#### Oral Bible Storytelling Expands in Nigeria

Our brothers and sisters at <u>Language Development and Translators</u>
<u>Association</u>, a local Nigerian organization, have completed successful trainings in Oral Bible Storytelling and will now work with the Seed Company orality team to pass along what they've learned and train others in their region.

#### PRAY FOR THE JARAWA PEOPLE IN NIGERIA

Only about 10% of <u>Jarawa people</u> are estimated to be Christians, though some say it's as high as 35%. The variation is likely due to some who identify as Christians but also continue practicing traditional religion.

#### **PRAY**

That as more of God's Word becomes available, Jarawa Christians will grow strong in their faith in Christ alone and those who do not believe will turn to Jesus.



#### PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT

#### Wati\* Cluster Oral Bible Storytelling in West Africa

The Wati Cluster Oral Bible Storytelling project has been reaching many people who practice another major world religion with the gospel. We prayed for one of them last December. Today, we praise God for another new believer named Susana\*.

Susana noticed that her family only followed their religion because it was family tradition, since they observed prayer times and holidays but didn't study their scriptures. But local leaders in that religion told her, "Before anyone should worship God, one has to know him first." It was through the Wati Cluster project that this desire of her heart was answered.

She learned that one's sins could be forgiven through simply believing and asking, and she began joining Christians as they told translated Bible stories in churches. Secretly, she began to attend church services.

#### **PRAISE**

- Recently, Susana gave her life to Christ and was baptized!
- God has given Wati Cluster storytellers favor with local authorities, which wasn't the case before.

#### **PRAY**

- That Susana will grow in faith and that God will draw the rest of her family to himself.
- That God will bring an end to youth violence in the area as young people receive his Word.

#### **Pray for Sierra Leone's Elections**

Sierra Leone's approaching election in June is a pivotal time to address key issues. Political intolerance exists between opposing parties, and hate speeches based on regionalism and tribalism are common. The economy is strained by the global economic crisis, and some desire to tamper with religious freedoms. All of these issues deeply affect local Bible translation teams and partnering churches.

For continued growth and impact for these two gentlemen, and for God to give them strength and endurance for the work he has called them to do.



# Pray for Interns in Nigeria Studying to Be Project Managers

#### **IMPACT STORY**

#### God Moves Through Oral Bible Storytelling in Nigeria

People who spoke the Ekpeye language were frustrated by not being able to clearly understand Scripture and preaching in church, since pastors usually used English and had to have an interpreter. That began to change with the Ekpeye Cluster Oral Bible Storytelling project.

When one woman who spoke the <u>Ekpeye</u> language came and heard translator Amakiri telling the story of Joseph interpreting Pharaoh's dreams, she saw a vision of Christ. At about the same time, her husband, who was waiting at home, heard people singing and clapping their hands and a voice telling him to go meet his wife. He walked into the church, and by the end of the service, they'd both decided to follow Christ!

#### **PRAISE**

Local Bible storytellers are hearing all kinds of stories like these happening across the region!

#### **PRAY**

For the truth of God's Word to continue changing hearts among the Ekpeye and other groups with Oral Bible Storytelling teams in Nigeria, and for the strength of the teams as they work despite economic and security difficulties.

#### Pray for Language Programs Coordination Forum in Nigeria

Language Programs Coordination Forum is composed of translation organizations in Nigeria that work with one another on trainings and other initiatives. They want to form a strategic plan to reach people who speak every remaining language in Nigeria.
