Sahel

In the Sahel region of Africa, God has provided strong partnerships among translation teams, churches, and mission organizations to help everyone have access to God's Word. These brothers and sisters persevere amid political instability, threats of violence from religious extremists, and severe droughts, which cause loss of crops and result in serious poverty.

To reach the day when zero people are without God's Word in this region, prayer is needed for the political, religious, and environmental climate. Pray 2 Corinthians 4:6 over the Sahel: "For God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of God's glory in the face of Jesus Christ." May the light of Christ shine to everyone in the Sahel through his Word.

Throughout this prayer journal, asterisks indicate when a pseudonym is being used due to security risks.

Regional Praise

Laka People of Chad Celebrate the Arrival of God's Word



On March 31, two leaders who'd been involved in the Laka New Testament translation shouted, "Today is the Day!" Their dreams were realized as they joined thousands to celebrate the arrival of the New Testament.

Shirts were distributed that read "Dieu Parle En Laka" in French and "Mbede le louba kone ga sigi" in Laka (English: "God Speaks Laka"). Choirs sang praises to God. Leaders testified to God's faithfulness and the translation team's perseverance since 2014. Now Laka people can read God's Word in their heart language!

PRAY

For transformed lives through God's Word in Laka. While most Laka people identify as Christian, animistic practices are still common. May the complete New Testament help them grow deep roots in the true gospel!

PRAY FOR A BIBLELESS PEOPLE GROUP Bagyele of Cameroon

The Bagyele (BAH–JEH–LEH) make a living as traditional healers, selling magic potions and charms. Many Bagyele people are hostile to Christianity because they don't feel welcome in churches, and their livelihood depends on their animistic practices. Praise God that a local Bagyele church has approached partners to begin Bible translation and bring transformation to their community!

PRAISE

CABTAL (<u>a partner organization we prayed for in January</u>) plans to partner with this local Bagyele church to begin an <u>Oral Bible Storytelling</u> project and a written translation of Luke. Cru will partner with them to produce the "JESUS" film in Gyele.

PRAY

That God will give the Bagyele renewed hope through following Jesus and help Christians from neighboring communities to love and respect them.



Pray for Protection from Boko Haram

The threat of violence and kidnapping by Boko Haram, mainly operating in an area of Nigeria bordered by Chad, Cameroon, and Niger, makes people afraid to sleep in their homes, work in their fields, or attend worship. Rainy season is the time for planting, and food supplies are running very low.

PRAY FOR PARTNERS SIL Mali

For over 40 years, SIL in Mali has worked with more than 20 languages. They advocate for local communities and use linguistics to help make meaningful interaction with Scripture possible for all. Their vision is to see everyone flourish as they use languages that matter most to them.

Our brothers and sisters at SIL Mali request prayer for a new responsibility they must add to their workload. Mali's government is now requiring every NGO to create monthly reports, which must be passed around and receive multiple signatures before finally being sent to the government.

PRAY

- That this new requirement will not slow down or hinder Bible translation progress.
- That God will give everyone involved the strength and ability to develop an efficient working system so they can incorporate this responsibility with patience and grace.

PRAY FOR ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT Amerek* of the Sahel

Amerek speakers, considered experts in the area's majority religion, are often asked by other people groups for advice and "charms" to provide protection. In the northern part of the country, more than 30% of the leaders of prayer and teachers of their holy book are Amerek speakers. Therefore, people are hesitant to accept Scripture for fear of criticism, shame, or even vengeance against those who listen to Scripture. Phone apps like WhatsApp provide anonymity for those listening to recorded Scripture.

PRAISE


A second Amerek project is underway, and more people are hearing the Bible in their heart language!

EQUIPPING THE SAINTS Cyriaque Moumben, CABTAL Intern

Cyriaque speaks nine languages—French, English, Shu Pamem, German, Basaá, Ewondo, Búlu, Kwasíó, and Swahili. He started volunteering with Cameroon Association for Bible Translation And Linguistics (CABTAL) as a literacy teacher and went on to support several translation projects.

Now, Cyriaque is finishing his master's degree in linguistics in preparation to be a linguistic consultant. He will continue to train translators and literacy teachers, conduct language surveys, and support efforts to produce literacy materials.

Sparking Interest in the Gospel Through WhatsApp

The Amba*, who predominantly follow another major world religion, are learning about Jesus through WhatsApp. In WhatsApp groups, Christian team members check the meanings of key terms with their non-believing neighbors. They also post Bible verses and record audio Scripture portions. Members of the Amba WhatsApp groups are active and look forward to getting more Scripture from the translators!

An Amba missionary in another African country, pleased that his people were discussing Scripture in their own language on WhatsApp, sent money to the translators, which is how the Amba diaspora began to support the project!


PRAY
