

# Southern Africa

The Southern Africa region spans about 20 countries, including several island nations. Partners in the region, such as Wycliffe South Africa, The Word For The World, Seed Company, and many more, have developed strong relationships and collaborate well together in Bible translation.

Political instability in some countries poses a challenge to reaching the day when all people groups in Southern Africa have God's Word. Some people still awaiting Scripture are in remote areas with poor roads. Prayer is also needed for the Lord to raise up more workers who will commit to translating for their own people groups and providing training for them.

Let's join in praying 1 Chronicles 4:10 over our brothers and sisters in Southern Africa who are working to bring God's Word to their people: "Oh, that you would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me, and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain."

# Regional Praise

### 17 Organizations Unite to Reach Southern Africa

From June 18–22, <u>Lutheran Bible Translators</u> and <u>Bible Society of Botswana</u> will host a summit for 17 organizations working in South Africa, Botswana, Namibia, Angola, Mozambique, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. This is the first time a meeting like this has ever been hosted in the region!

Recently, they'd experienced some overlap in trying to start projects and miscommunication about what each organization was doing. This summit will help them communicate more clearly with local communities about how they can work with them to support their Bible translation goals. "If we are aware of what other organizations are doing, it might open up possibilities for mutual aid," they say.

# PRAY FOR A BIBLELESS PEOPLE GROUP Zambian Sign Language

Many of the world's remaining Bibleless people are Deaf. With this great need in mind, the <u>Zambian Bible Society</u> is eager to begin the translation process for the Deaf in their country.

Estimates vary widely as to the number of Deaf people in Zambia; some say 14,400, some 50,000, and others as many as 154,000. Regardless of the actual number, every one of them is a person God longs to reach with his love.

Deafness is generally viewed negatively. In many cultures, Deaf people are considered disabled, and others may view them as possessed or think deafness is a punishment from God. The hearing community tends to make decisions for them without their input. Through this sign language project, which will be locally owned and run, the Deaf will come to know God instead of knowing about him.

#### **PRAY**

Ask God to help the translators quickly grasp the translation principles when they go to Kenya for training.



### **Pray for Zimbabwe Elections**

Regarding important elections coming up in August, Stephen Gwasira, General Secretary at <u>Bible Society of Zimbabwe</u>, asks for:

- God's wisdom and guidance before, during, and after the election.
- Free and fair elections, with zero tolerance to violence.
- Acceptance of supervision of independent monitors and observers and the outcome of the election.

# PRAY FOR PARTNERS Partners in Bible Translation

<u>Partners in Bible Translation</u> (PIBT) is a partner organization that has been involved in Bible translation with the <u>Kunda</u>, <u>Toka</u>, and <u>Leya</u> languages in Zambia. The Kunda New Testament was completed in December 2021, but the final readthrough and typesetting took nine more months to finish. Praise God that the New Testament will finally be dedicated and distributed in a dedication celebration that <u>Kunda Bible Translation and Literacy</u> is planning this August!

#### **PRAY**

- Several distractions in the past two years have slowed progress for the Toka-Leya team. Pray for God to renew their focus, passion, and vision.
- That God will call the right person to replace the exegete for the Toka-Leya translation project who died last year.
- That PIBT's plans to print the Gospel of Mark in July for the Toka and Leya communities will go smoothly.
- That the completed New Testament will have a powerful impact on the lives of Kunda people.



## Pray Now

South Africa now has 10 to 16 hours per day without electricity, which greatly hinders Bible translation work. Pray for both literal and spiritual light to pierce the darkness in this country.

### A Note from the Nyaneka-Mwila Field Project Manager

The above verse is a favorite of the Nyaneka-Mwila translation team. They say, "To be victorious in our mission, we must value each step of the translation process. We pray for a healthy balance between speed and accuracy, and we pray to make wise choices at the end of the translation process when spiritual attack is often heightened." Local believers are praying that Scripture will help heal social issues like cattle raids, substance abuse, domestic violence, and limited access to health care.

# PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT Nyaneka-Mwila of Angola

Though many are familiar with elements of Christianity, most Nyaneka-Mwila people rely on traditional spells or rituals to bring success or deal with problems. But in recent years, the number of committed Christ followers has grown!

When Nyaneka-Mwila speakers recently heard portions of Leviticus and Numbers in their own language for the first time, one listener said:

"Many don't attend church because they don't understand the language that is used. That's why it is important that the Word of God be available in the language that people understand, so that more people are saved."

Another listener agreed, "Through this Bible, many Nyaneka will be saved because they will hear the Word of God in their own language."

#### **PRAY**

For a smooth typesetting and printing process so the New Testament can be officially launched and distributed.

The Kunda people, whom we also highlighted on Tuesday, live near South Luangwa National Park, the largest national park in Zambia. Praise God that the number of Christians has grown to about 80% since the gospel was introduced in 1910! Their New Testament is now complete, and a dedication celebration is scheduled for August 19th.

### Kaaps Performance: An Answered Prayer in South Africa

Last September, we prayed for a new Bible translation project in the Kaaps community of South Africa. Kaaps speakers are descendants of the multiple ethnic groups that lived in the Cape region under European colonization, many of whom were enslaved and oppressed.

Praise God that Kaaps people are no longer Bibleless! Since mid-2022, a group of Kaaps musicians and poets have been meeting regularly with the <u>Psalms</u> that Sing team to orally translate Psalms. At the beginning of April, they held a production to share some of these biblical poems with their community through drama, comedy, music, and dance. People were on their feet, singing, dancing, and worshiping God in their heart language!

#### **PRAY**

One attendee said, "I have a renewed sense of pride in who I am and how God made me." Pray that more Kaaps people will understand that they are fearfully and wonderfully made by a good God as they worship in their own language.

#### **PRAISE**

The songs produced from the Psalms are already being sung in churches and shared on social media.
