Some Bibleless people are in remote areas with poor roads, while others live in areas with political instability. More workers are needed to provide training for translators.

LuminAfrica: Praising God in the Pruning

Pruning seasons can be challenging, but they are necessary for God's next season of growth. Bible translation leaders with <u>LuminAfrica</u>, a group of translation agencies in the Southern Africa region, request prayer for a pruning season right now as they go through an organizational transition.

At a recent gathering, they reflected on John 15 and the Greek verb καθαρός, which can mean "prune" or "be clean." During this season, they believe the Holy Spirit is laying new support structures to help them bear more fruit in the future and achieve their purpose of bringing Scripture to all languages in Southern Africa.

PRAY FOR A BIBLELESS PEOPLE GROUP Angolar of São Tomé and Príncipe

Angolar people number fewer than 8,000 and live in the poorest area of the second smallest country in Africa: São Tomé and Príncipe, an island nation. Angolar people live in the southern part of this country, preserving their culture and *n'golá*, their unique creole language. They have a rich oral tradition, but their language is not written, which means no access to any Scripture or Christian resources in their language.

Many Angolar identify as Christian; others practice African Traditional Religion. Evangelists haven't been able to reach certain parts of the island due to poor infrastructure. But time and time again, all over the world, oral Bible stories travel quickly from person to person where outside evangelists can't.

PRAY

• For God's protection over São Tomé, especially the Angolar community. Ask for better living conditions, improved education, and for an oral translation project to begin soon among these people.

PRAY FOR PARTNERS Hands with Words: Meeting Growing Sign Language Needs in Southern Africa

Sign language Bible translation needs are growing in Southern African countries. At the heart of it is <u>Hands with Words</u>. To date, they've released two sets of South African Sign Language Bible passages, as well as a theological dictionary, songs, and an evangelistic tool for the Deaf.

Now, neighboring countries are looking to Hands with Words to assist with training, Scripture engagement, and church planting activities.

PRAISE

• The South African Sign Language team will soon complete the full Chronological Bible Translation, which consists of key Bible stories from Genesis to Revelation. Then they'll translate the rest of the Bible!

<u>Faith Comes By Hearing</u> and Seed Company are currently in the process of starting 33 Oral Bible Translation projects! Praise God that Faith Comes By Hearing plans to initiate an additional 60 Oral Bible Translations in the coming year.

Faith Comes By Hearing is renowned for making the Bible accessible to diverse communities. They host workshops to introduce the oral translation process to interested national partners. These partners, inspired by the mission, unite to form translation teams. The success of these teams greatly depends on their own passion and commitment and also the prayers of God's people.

PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT Cokwe in Angola

Watch a Cokwe song based on Psalm 84, along with readings of verses 1–2 and 10–11.

The Cokwe people (pronounced CHO-kwe) have a Portuguese colonial heritage, and all adult Angolans have personal memories of the long civil war that finally ended in 2002. The <u>Psalms That Sing</u> project works with local poets and musicians to bring the Psalms to life in languages that were marginalized under colonialism.

PRAY

• For more women to join upcoming workshops and be able to contribute fully and freely.



PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT Wantu* in Malawi

The Wantu people are a large, mainly Muslim people group in an area still struggling to recover from Hurricane Freddy. Psalms that Sing is working with a partner mission to translate Psalms into Wantu and bring them to life through performance.

A local Wantu minister says: "This is a culture that likes singing. In these workshops, we are taking traditional music and putting words to it from the Psalms, so when people listen, it will be like their own songs. They will be singing them everywhere; when they go to the mountain to fetch firewood, when they fetch water, go to the mill.... It is putting the word of God in their hearts. That is what I want for my community."

- For God to open up avenues for distribution, especially over local radio.

EQUIPPING THE SAINTS Pray for Napo Mosito of Bible Society of Lesotho

Lesotho (pronounced luh-SOO-too) is a landlocked country encircled by South Africa, separated by tall mountain ranges and narrow valleys. As General Secretary of Bible Society of Lesotho, Napo oversees translation projects, but he also helps with accounting, general management, funding, and promotion of Bible translation work. He is married to Makabelo and blessed with three boys (Kabelo, 11; Kateleho, 3; and Kamohelo, 2).

PRAISE

• Napo has been provisionally accepted to a postgraduate program in business administration at South African university to further his project management skills.

PRAY

• For God to make a way for him to study in South Africa, since the South African government has yet to recognize his Lesotho qualifications. He's been waiting more than 6 months for approval.

IMPACT STORY

Mansonka People of Guinea-Bissau Learn Jesus Is for Them

Mansonka means "refused" because the Mansonka historically refused to be ruled by the Muslim Mandinga people. Nevertheless, currently, about 89% of them profess Islam. There are few Christ followers among them, but many see Bible translation as an opportunity to change the course of history in their community.

A woman named Banna Djatá stood up at an event, saying, "Previously, according to the teachings of our ancestors, we Mansonkas thought that Satan is the creator and owner of everything around us. We've heard about God and Jesus, but we thought it was only for Europeans and Americans. Finally, this translation brings light into our community, and everything that was hidden has been revealed in this Book."

• For hearts to be inspired by Banna's words and for the translation team as they continue to bring light to this community.
