Bafumbira of Uganda Receive New Testament

Around 1.3 million Bafumbira people live among the fertile hills of southwestern Uganda. Though most identify as Christian, they had no access to Scripture in their own language of Rufumbira until recently. A few months ago, they celebrated completing the entire New Testament!

All the local Christian denominations, from Pentecostals to Anglicans and Catholics, were represented at this celebration, in addition to local political and business leaders. All rejoiced and praised God for his love letter to them in their heart language!

For God to pour out rivers of provision to the Bible Society of Uganda as they respond to the community's requests for Old Testament translation. May God hasten the day when the entire Rufumbira Bible is available!

PRAY FOR A BIBLELESS PEOPLE GROUP Kahe of Tanzania

The Kahe people, with an estimated population of 10,000, live in the eastern region of Tanzania, south of Mt. Kilimanjaro. They mainly farm and cultivate livestock. While many Kahe people also speak Swahili, their heart language is closely tied to their identity. Kahe churches are enthusiastic about getting the Bible in their own language to enrich and deepen their worship.

PRAISE

- For the interest and support shown by Kahe church leaders.
- For the permits some local partners have already received.

PRAY

- For God to provide community support and the right people to guide and support this project.
- For Tanzania's government to provide permits so language workers can gain access to the Kahe area.

PRAY FOR PARTNERS Ethiopian Kale Heywet Church

Founded in 1913, Ethiopian Kale Heywet Church (EKHC) is a prominent evangelical church in Ethiopia. Currently, EKHC has 10,000 local congregations with 12 million members. They've been involved in Bible translation since their inception, and they've been working with Wycliffe Global Alliance and Seed Company toward the day when all remaining Ethiopian language groups begin Bible translation. There may only be 3 left, according to ProgressBible!

PRAISE

For this church's impact, including 40 missionary families sent out of Ethiopia, 2,000 national missionary families within Ethiopia, nine local theological colleges, and 150 local Bible schools.

PRAY

For wisdom for EKHC leaders who are seeking to expand evangelism in areas in the north and east of Ethiopia, where there is serious resistance.

PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT

Gawali* Oral Bible Translation in East Africa

Most of the 55,000 Gawali people identify as Muslim, and many mix their faith with traditional animism, but God's Word in their language is spreading the truth of the gospel.

During a revision of Philippians 3, the nonbelieving translators were already being challenged by the concept that human effort to obey the law cannot earn righteousness before God, but then came the bomb: everything this world values—even community relationships and marriage—is as nothing compared to the surpassing worth of knowing Jesus.

PRAY

That the Gawali would do more than just understand (although this is wonderful) but be transformed by God's Word and surrender their lives to Jesus.

PRAISE

That they have grasped more clearly that our relationship with God comes through Jesus, not through our own righteousness or human effort.

IMPACT STORY Pokomo People of Kenya Receive Full Bible

While the Pokomo people were historically animist, more and more of them are turning to Christ and walking deeply in his ways. They treasure their newly completed Bible—after all, they've been waiting for it more than 38 years.

People were so excited to receive the full Bible that they couldn't wait for the day of the dedication; people began dancing the night before and kept dancing until morning! Men, women, and youth all read publicly from the Word, to represent the truth that God's Word is for male and female, elderly and young alike.

One partner at the organization Bible Translation and Literacy, Caroline Kamau, remarked, "It's been 38 years to get the Bible, and the man who was paralyzed and lame at the pool of Bethesda waited 38 years for someone to help him get into the pool." On this day, all Pokomo people were finally able to plunge into the healing waters of the full counsel of Scripture.

One man jumped up and down with his Bible, saying he'd received gold. Another said it was like the joy of the birth of a new child after pregnancy and labor. Still another person said, "We may be a small people group, but we are a people with an identity, and God knows us enough to get the Word into our language!"
