One notable community leader practiced African Traditional Religion and had many shrines at home. But after receiving God's Word in Ndrulo, he began following Christ and destroyed the shrines!

Molo of South Sudan

Molo is spoken by fewer than 2,000 people in South Sudan. While around 18% are Christian, according to <u>Joshua Project</u>, most Molo speakers practice African Traditional Religion. People who primarily speak Molo at home must rely on interpreters at church in order to comprehend the message, which is taught in another language.

Interestingly, traditional African religious rituals and cultural events *are* conducted in Molo. Perhaps if they can access God's Word just as readily in their own language, the minority Christian community can grow and multiply more rapidly.

PRAY

For the pieces to come together in God's timing as we seek to begin Bible translation in the Molo language. May God provide the right people and resources to begin this project.



For the Rufumbira translation team as they work on the Old Testament after completing the New Testament. "Uncle" Ezra has retired from leading the team after long, faithful service, and has passed his mantle to Reverend Gideon. Pray for this team as they work to finish the good work they started, and pray that Uncle Ezra will be blessed in retirement as he watches the fruits of his labor transform the community.

A Deaf Bible Translator and Video Editor in Kenya See Their Impact

When Simon, a <u>Kenya Sign Language</u> translator, and Edwin, a <u>DOOR</u> <u>International</u> video editor, attended a Deaf church, the pastor preached from <u>Acts 16:11–40</u> using Kenya Sign Language. In this story, Paul and Silas are praising God in prison when an earthquake breaks their bonds and opens the prison doors. The jailer ends up accepting Christ.

After hearing this story, one Deaf man named George declared that he too wanted to be saved. He said, "In the past, I acted sinfully. I was a drunkard. I fought people and did so much more. I need forgiveness and salvation."

PRAY

- For continued encouragement for those working behind the scenes at DOOR, like Simon and Edwin, as they see the fruit of their labor.
- For George to continue walking in freedom and life-giving community.



For the Gayil team in Ethiopia as they work on the Old Testament, and for Gayil speakers to be changed as they encounter the recently-published New Testament (many Gayil speakers are Christian, but animistic practices are also common). One local leader said that now "evangelism will be very easy, because they can just read the Word and it is sufficient to change many." May their momentum and encouragement continue!

PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT Vidunda of East Africa

Vidunda is part of the Selous <u>Cluster project</u> (which we prayed for <u>last year</u>) and is spoken by about 19,000 people who live among mountains. While many are Christian, many also practice ancestor worship.

Translator Nestory (pictured with his family) used to work as a welder before the Lord called him into Bible translation. In addition to leading the Vidunda team, he has recently become the program director for Pioneer Bible Translators in East Africa.

PRAISE

- That the Vidunda team expects to finish the whole Bible by the end of 2026!
- That Nestory will be able to serve more translation teams in his new leadership role.

PRAY

• For stable internet and protection from spiritual warfare for the translators; spiritual attacks often increase right at the end of a project.

Trauma Healing and Peace Building in Ethiopia

Simret Fekadu, who we prayed for <u>last July</u>, recently helped train people from the Ale, Konso, and Dirashe communities of Ethiopia in trauma healing and peacebuilding. These three groups have endured horrific events, but trauma healing programs are helping Scripture go from their heads to their hearts.

"God sent you to save my life," said one participant who works in Christian ministry. "I considered suicide recently. I have all I need, yet I had a battle in my mind. Now, I am emotionally at peace and feel as though something has left from inside of me."

Translators request, "Please join in praying that the glory of the Lord will shine through this translation project." May all Oyda speakers be set free from traditional practices aimed at appeasing evil spirits.

"Our Faithfulness, God's Work": A Devotional and Testimony from the Suri Team in Ethiopia

The Suri people live in southwestern Ethiopia, spread across a mountain range and two river valleys. They rely heavily on annual rains, and food is often scarce between April and June. Suri translators are finishing the New Testament and aim to publish it in 2025. Young churches are actively using the Scripture available so far, and they eagerly anticipate the spiritual growth that the full New Testament will bring.
