REGIONAL UPDATE

A Center for Bible Translation in Democratic Republic of Congo

Seven years ago, the <u>Fellowship of Labor Churches</u>, a local church network in Democratic Republic of Congo, embraced Scripture translation as a mission strategy in two provinces that are comparable in size to Uganda. As church members went out into the villages to initiate Bible translation, they began developing a team and locating facilities for training translators and hosting workshops. Today, these facilities host regular gatherings in excess of a dozen translation teams, plus consultants and partners, providing lodging, meals, electricity, internet, work space, equipment, and expertise to accelerate the work.

For developing this center for Bible translation in the heart of the difficult-to-access interior of this country.

For wisdom and discernment for this church network as they pursue a long-term vision for Scripture translation and engagement in the region they serve.

Pray for Bibleless People Groups in Democratic Republic of Congo

Twelve people groups in Democratic Republic of Congo totaling more than 280,000 people have been eagerly anticipating the day when they will be able to hear and share Bible stories in their heart language. These communities have requested training and assistance from the Fellowship of Labor Churches, who we prayed for yesterday, and they are currently praying for funding to begin Oral Bible Storytelling projects.

PRAISE

In November, representatives from churches in eight of these communities met with representatives from the Fellowship of Labor Churches and Seed Company to express their commitment to Bible translation and their ardent and urgent desire for work to begin in their languages.

PRAY

- That all barriers would be removed for the launch of Bible translation in these languages.
- For God's perfect timing to bring Scripture to each of these languages and that the churches would remain prayerful and encouraged until work begins.

TRANSLATED SCRIPTURE: GISIR [GIH – SEER'] LANGUAGE OF GABON

And those who are peacemakers will plant seeds of peace and reap a harvest of righteousness.

PRAY FOR THE GISIR PEOPLE

Please pray that the Gisir community will use the translated Scriptures widely throughout their homes and churches. Pray for open hearts and minds as they engage with God's Word so that it may become a vital part of their daily lives.

Pray also for the screening of the "JESUS" film in Gisir. May it lead to deeper and greater understanding of the message of Christ. Pray James 3:18 over these teams, that as they plant the gospel of peace, they will reap a harvest of righteousness in their communities.



PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT Tsaangi in Republic of Congo

While the gospel came to the Tsaangi people in the early 1900s, and 80% identify as Christians today, many are still heavily influenced by sorcery and traditional religion. Often, people visit a medium when they get sick.

After waiting decades for Scripture in their own language, the <u>Tsaangi</u> community is getting closer to receiving the full New Testament, which the translation team hopes to complete by 2027.

PRAISE

For the churches and small groups that are already actively using translated audio Scriptures.

PRAY

For the spiritual and physical development of the Tsaangi people, and for protection and health for the translation teams.

Consultant in Training Stéphane Mulamba in Democratic Republic of Congo

Stéphane Mulamba, a pastor with over a decade of experience in Bible translation, is scheduled to begin a three-year internship on December 15. He is the first intern to come from the Fellowship of Labor Churches, whom we prayed for on Sunday. During this time, Stéphane will study and work full-time as he develops core skills in translation consulting under the guidance of his mentors and supervisor. As a consultant, Stéphane will serve as an advisor and an encourager to translation teams, helping them to produce Scripture translations that are clear, accurate, natural, and acceptable.

For emotional resilience and overall health for Stéphane and his family during the busy season of this internship.
