Sunday REGIONAL UPDATE

Local Leaders Collaborate to Meet Remaining Scripture Needs in Indonesia

In late November, 108 leaders of churches and Bible translation organizations across Indonesia gathered for strategic meetings. They aim to provide Scripture to the country's remaining languages still needing God's Word. A highlight from their time together was praying over a map of the country and asking for God's guidance.

These organizations and churches discussed being involved in over 100 languages. Dozens of these languages are set to begin brand-new projects in 2025!

PRAISE

- That local church leaders are taking a greater role in Bible translation.
- That the meetings resulted in specific plans to reach the country's remaining language groups.

PRAY

- For unity and wisdom as these leaders work together to meet the needs of their country's Bibleless people groups.
- For protection as new projects begin in 2025.

A Five-Language Project in Islands Asia Plans to Explore an Innovative Approach

The Lembata [LEM – BAH' – TAH] project, scheduled to begin in January, will begin translation for five people groups—none of which have Scripture in their languages.

The team is experimenting with an approach that builds an artificial intelligence (AI) model of the language from sentences they collect in the communities (instead of from previously translated Scripture). Translated Scripture will be fed back into the model to refine and improve it for further translation.

PRAISE

The team has already begun to collect data from the community, even though the project hasn't officially started.

PRAY

The data collection process will take a few months to complete. Pray for the team to get the information they need to build an accurate AI model. Pray that we will learn whether this approach will be helpful for other language communities.



For the Parem team's upcoming consultant check of Luke 12–24. In July, we prayed for ill team members and the need for additional translators. Please pray that the Parem team facilitator and translators will remain faithful and motivated to complete their tasks despite falling behind other teams in their cluster project, due to these challenges.

Wycliffe Malaysia

Malaysia has more than 136 people groups, many of whom still do not have God's Word in their heart language. <u>Wycliffe Malaysia</u> seeks to address remaining Bible translation needs in Malaysia and also send Malaysians to serve in Bible translation worldwide.

PRAISE

• The "JESUS" film has been completed in four Malaysian language groups!

PRAY

- For more like-minded people to partner with Wycliffe Malaysia as they start new translation projects.
- For efficiency, effectiveness, and joy in their work.
- For God to grant wisdom to the Executive Director, that she may be sensitive to His guidance.
- For the eight language groups in West Malaysia still needing God's Word in their heart language.
- For more Malaysian churches to be aware of the remaining translation needs in their country.



For Mondou people in an Asian village where a severe fire has impacted or displaced 74 families and demolished 44 homes. One quarter of the second largest village in the area was destroyed. Team members have been working to translate remaining Gospels and additional New Testament books to communicate the hope of Christ in the midst of heartache.

PRAISE

PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT Tiow [TEE'-AW] of Islands Asia

Tiow is spoken in a region of Islands Asia where Buddhism and Confucianism are the predominant religions. Christians are a minority, and there is not yet known to be an all-Tiow church. Those who become believers are strongly pressured to continue worshipping the spirits of their ancestors and participating in rituals to bring good luck.

PRAY

With very few believers and no Tiow church, the team sometimes has trouble translating words like "God," "temple," and "sacrifice." They must decide whether to use local terms, which are often closely connected to their ancestral religion, or to borrow terms from other languages. Please pray for the team as they determine what words will best communicate God's message.

EQUIPPING THE SAINTS

Winata Setiawan in Islands Asia

Winata became involved with Bible translation ministry in 2015 when he joined <u>Kartidaya's</u> member care team. As he observed how translation work is done, he heard many testimonies of how the Bible transforms people's lives.

In 2021, Winata started training as a translation team facilitator. His background as a pastor helps in Scripture interpretation, and his studies in pastoral counseling help him facilitate the translation team he works with. Winata is currently being trained as a translation consultant.

PRAISE

Winata will help address the translation consultant shortage in Islands Asia. As more consultants become available, more translations can be started and checked in a timely way.

PRAY

Please pray for good health, strength, and wisdom as Winata balances his training with work responsibilities.



For a smooth transition among team members working on the <u>Pitsuha</u> <u>translation</u>, as some translators' health is declining with age. The team hopes to find new translators while others are still healthy enough to be effective mentors. Also, praise God that the team's work is ahead of schedule and they will likely finish the project with more Scriptures translated than they originally planned.

IMPACT STORY

Sarangani Blaan of the Philippines

Roughly 112,000 people speak Sarangani Blaan. About 90% of them are Christian. They mostly live in rural areas where their way of life remains distinct. Today, for the first time, a whole generation of Sarangani Blaan speakers will grow up reading Old Testament stories in their language.

After reading 1 Kings 17:8–16, one 8-year-old girl remarked, "My grandmother gets sad when rice starts to run out. I told my widowed grandmother, like the story we just read, that we need to give and feed people who are hungry, because the blessing of God never runs out. Even if the situation is desperate, the Lord will provide."

PRAISE

That children are understanding and applying Sarangani Blaan Scripture to their lives!
