REGIONAL UPDATE Translators Attend Scripture Forge Training

In February, SIL Global, a linguistics and translation organization, hosted translation teams in Entebbe, Uganda, for training in Scripture Forge. This artificial intelligence (AI) application enables teams to increase their speed, efficiency, and accuracy in producing Scripture drafts.

Seed Company also provided training, where teams learned about:

- Accelerated drafting techniques—using AI-assisted drafting tools and software.
- Implementing mid-level quality assurance workers to ensure consistent quality.
- A cluster checking approach—encouraging translators from related language teams to work together.
- Using daily accountability tools to track progress and provide real-time updates to stakeholders.

PRAY

- That teams can apply this knowledge to their translation projects.
- That Scripture will begin reaching local communities more quickly and with increased accuracy.

Ganza Speakers Need Scripture

The Ganza—a cross-border people group of 4,400—have never had access to God's Word in their language. Approximately 3,700 Ganza speakers live in the Blue Nile region of Sudan. 97% of the population adheres to Islam, and 3% identify as Christians. The remaining 700 Ganza speakers live in Ethiopia and adhere entirely to Islam. Though the Ganza are small in number, they are proud of their linguistic and cultural heritage. Every generation speaks the language, from grandparents down to small children.

Evangelical Fellowship of Ethiopia (ECFE) is working closely with SIL Ethiopia and other partners to conduct surveys and pave the way for a translation project among this group. They believe an oral strategy like Oral Bible Stories would be the most effective way to begin.

For wisdom and discernment as ECFE and SIL Ethiopia evaluate possibilities for starting a Bible translation project among the Ganza people.

New Methods for Old Testaments

Some 9 language teams from the Mbeya Cluster project in Tanzania completed New Testaments between 2019 and 2023. Since then, <u>SIL Tanzania</u> has been preparing for Old Testament translation in many of these languages. So far, four languages have begun projects led by Community Based Organizations (CBO), whom SIL is training and equipping to assume management soon.

Kinga, Ndali [N-DAH'-LEE], Nyakyusa [NYAH-KYOO'-SUH], and Vwanji [VWAHN'-JEE] translators recently helped to research artificial intelligence (AI) for drafting. Through capacity building and using innovative technology, these language groups should soon have the complete Bible available to them.

That AI drafting and CBO capacity building will yield accelerated access to quality Old Testaments.

The Rufumbira language team in Uganda was recently introduced to a new tool for managing translation goals. This pilot project, TranTrak, allows everybody involved in the project to easily track daily progress and access it in real time.

During the training trip, Seed Company Field Project Manager Leah Knippel spent time with translators, a translation consultant, and the community review team of leaders from every church in Kisoro.

One highlight was when "Uncle Ezra," the chairman of the community review team, led a hike up "prayer mountain" in Kisoro, an inactive cratered volcano on land once owned by his grandfather.
