PRAYER UPDATES FROM AROUND THE WORLD

One of our translators, Agabus, considers himself to be an atheist, but his work has been important to our completion of the Bible. He has not been able to speak since surgeons operated on his ear and found another growth affecting his throat. Pray for Agabus' physical recovery and that the Lord will give him a new heart through the Scriptures he translates.

Anglophone West Africa

"Anglophone" refers to countries where English is used as a trade language. This week, we're praying for the Anglophone West African nations of Nigeria, Ghana, Liberia, Sierra Leone, and The Gambia, where God has provided incredible unity and local leadership among ministries with diverse strengths. Bible translation has accelerated rapidly in Nigeria over the last few years, decreasing the number of languages waiting to be engaged from 200+ to fewer than 40 today.

Challenges in the region include social and economic instability, persecution, corruption, lack of training, and false teaching. Many projects are brand new and need fervent prayer to bring their good work to completion.

Unprecedented Boldness in Nigeria and Progress in Ghana

In Northern Nigeria, new Muslim converts are going on social media and declaring, "Whether I live or I die, I am choosing to follow Jesus," and, "Even if all of the Muslims of the world are against me, I am choosing to become a Christian!" Praise God for such boldness!

At the same time, Bible translators are making unprecedented progress in Ghana. By 2027, 9 Ghanaian language groups are projected to receive their first full Bibles! This will enable many to read God's Word in the language closest to their hearts.

Oral Bible Stories Evoke Strong Responses

The Rang language translation team began work on oral Bible stories less than a year ago, but narratives surrounding the arrest and resurrection of Jesus are already bearing fruit.

After hearing stories in his own language, a man named Michael shed tears and confessed that he now comprehends the extent of Jesus' suffering on our behalf. Salome, who previously harbored doubts about Christ, publicly acknowledged that Jesus is not merely human, but truly divine.

Martin said that he initially perceived the accounts of Jesus' resurrection as mere theatrics, but came to believe in its veracity after hearing the stories in Rang. The stories also helped Rebecca overcome her astonishment and comprehend the concept of a dead human's resurrection.

West Africa Christian Mission in Nigeria

The Mbembe Cluster project includes three Nigerian language groups—Adun, Okom, and Osopong—that are interconnected geographically, linguistically, and ethnically. Bible translation pioneer Dr. Katy Barnwell served as one of the primary translation consultants on this project since its inception years ago.

West Africa Christian Mission has been a strong partner in managing the Mbembe Cluster project since 2018. Their mission is to win the lost and to train and equip national Christian leaders, and they offer a 3-year program that awards a diploma in Christian Ministry. They also run a healthcare facility and partner with a foundation to produce Sunday School manuals for churches and Christian groups.

PRAY

That the West Africa Christian Mission organization will continue to grow and deepen their impact on Bible translation in the region.



The Language Program Manager (LPM) Cohort—made up of 13 interns and 2 mentors from 11 different Bible translation organizations—will conclude this September in Abuja. This will mark the end of a meaningful 2.5-year journey of learning and growing through both virtual and in-person gatherings. Pray for the LPMs as they continue in their development post-cohort. Pray that they will seek and apply God's wisdom as they pursue Bible translation efforts throughout Nigeria.

PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT

Chala Project in Ghana

In December 2022, <u>we prayed</u> for translation work to begin soon in the Chala language. A project began less than a year later, and team members now report that it has progressed so swiftly that they are ahead of schedule!

The team proposes adding new goals that include John, Philippians, and Colossians, as well as developing literacy materials. At the current pace, the Chala New Testament will be completed in the next few years.

"Our success is by God's grace," project coordinator Lambert says. His ability to learn the language quickly allowed for faster checks during drafting, which also accelerated team checking. Dedicated translators and support from partners have also been vital to the team's success.

That God will continue equipping team members with strength and wisdom as they fix their eyes on completing the Chala New Testament.

Field partner LIST (Luke Initiative for Scripture Translation) in Nigeria has been working diligently to expand its financial capacity. The process began with laying a solid foundation in project management and reporting through a 3-year internship for the cash officer.

Now, Seed Company's Growth Partners team is facilitating the transition from a manual bookkeeping system to QuickBooks Online. This will improve efficiency and access to financial data, providing LIST with the tools and training needed to support the many projects they manage.

They are working to produce an Oral Bible Translation with Transcription of Genesis, Ruth, Jonah, Mark, John, Acts, and 1–2 Timothy. Pray that those participating in listening groups in each language would meet regularly, listen to the Scriptures, and promote the translation recordings in their communities.
