PRAYER UPDATES FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Pray for Ndi Dominique. He is a Global Translation Leader (formerly called intern) who has just returned to work after his father's funeral. As the oldest son, he is now head of the family and is taking on new responsibilities as they continue to grieve.

Pray that God's faithfulness in providing for translation work in our area of Mainland Asia will always be evident and bring glory to His name. Pray that He will keep stirring the hearts of people and organizations to fund every new and ongoing project without delay, so that people everywhere receive His Word in the language they know best.

REGIONAL UPDATE

Samburu Hymnbook and Psalms Dedicated

The Samburu community in Kenya gathered to dedicate the book of Psalms and a hymn book in their language. Hundreds of people from the Samburu community, translators, church leaders (including bishops), and students (in their school uniforms) attended the dedication ceremony.

There was a lot of dancing and singing as they received the book of Psalms in their language. A group of 22 children recited memorized Psalms in Samburu.

That Samburu speakers are now able to sing hymns and read Psalms in their heart language.

The Konyamo Cluster - Koma Language

The Koma people have a rich cultural heritage, yet historically, few have been reached with the gospel. Led by partner Bible Translation and Literacy (BTL), the Koma translation project is advancing on several fronts. A writing system has been established, training in language development and Bible translation occurred, and literacy awareness is underway.

The translation of Luke's Gospel has excited the community, with some declaring, "God has finally remembered the Koma people!"

PRAISE

That God is moving among the Koma people, bringing transformation, hope, and revival as they encounter His Word in their language.

PRAY

- For the country's leaders and for peace in the region.
- That God's light would continue to shine on the Koma people, and that they might experience joy, grow in the knowledge of His Word, and witness the fulfillment of His promises in their heart language.



Please pray that preparations will go smoothly for the planned launch of the Matumbi New Testament in Tanzania on November 1. Pray that the books arrive on time, and for all the arrangements, including travel safety for guests. Pray, too, that many Matumbi speakers will use the New Testaments to grow in their faith and learn more about Jesus.

One of SIL SS's most notable success stories is the active involvement of language committees in the Bible translation process. This approach fosters meaningful engagement across diverse church denominations and community groups—including women and youth—which adds significant value to the project.

Youth Want Kuku Scripture, Literacy Training

When 1 Corinthians 13 (see v. 13 above) was read in a Kuku church service, a young person observed that it was easier to understand than Bari Scripture. Though closely related to Kuku, Bari differs slightly in spelling, tone, accent, and vocabulary. With no Scripture in their heart language, the Kuku community has historically used the Bari Bible.

Elders are typically more fluent in Bari, while younger people mainly use English to read Scripture. Using Kuku Scriptures in church can help people understand the Bible more clearly than relying solely on Scripture in other languages.

Some young people have requested literacy training in Kuku. The Kuku Bible Project plans to launch and operate a literacy program alongside translation efforts.

PRAISE

That young people are excited to listen to and read Kuku Scriptures.

PRAY

For the Kuku team as they translate several New Testament books.



PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT

Small Steps Forward

Most people in the Karama community of 80,000 follow another major world religion, but the small Christian minority treasures God's Word and the joy they find there. Remarkably, even followers of the other religion have started encouraging translators and supporting the work.

In the last year or so, about 30 people have accepted Christ as their Savior. Four did so after the dedication of Exodus and Mark. The numbers may seem small, but the impact on the Christian community is big as the gospel is shared through stories, text, and audio.

PRAISE

- For interest in the gospel among unbelievers and people coming to faith.
- That many Karama people are requesting songs in their language. An Ethnomusicology workshop is planned in the near future.



Thursday

IT Capacity Builder Bonane Salumoni

Bonane Salumoni is a Global Translation Leader (formerly called intern) in Capacity Building. He's completed his Diploma in ICT and is pursuing his Bachelor of Science, Computer Science at Jordan University College.

Bonane is working on ways to more effectively support the IT challenges faced by his colleagues at The Word for the World Tanzania. Projects include establishing a ticketing system for IT issues; creating a manual and training videos for implementing and supporting their in-house translation project management software; and teaching computer and digital literacy courses in their Diploma in Bible Translation program.

PRAISE

That God has been providing for Bonane's studies. "My love for the Bible translation activities grows day by day," he says.

PRAY

For his health, strength, and the ability to finish his studies well.



Pray for translation partner The Word for the World as their teams will be completing the New Testament in many languages over the next several years. Pray that God would provide sufficient funds to cover printing of Scripture as well as literacy initiatives that will help all speakers of these languages to be able to read the newly translated Scriptures with fluency.

Yosephina's Story

"With eyes full of yearning, she confessed, 'I have always wanted a Bible but cannot afford one." That's how Phionah, a Rufumbira team member, recalls their interaction. Phionah gently responded, "Would you be able to read it?" "No," Yosefina whispered, having never attended school.

"Her desperation was sacred—the cry of a soul searching for peace," says Phionah. She told Yosefina about the Rufumbira audio Bible and promised, "Tomorrow, I will bring you one."

When she received her audio player, Yosefina touched it like a fragile treasure and said, "I will gather my friends. Every day, we shall listen at 3 pm." Later, her brother called, saying, "The gadget never leaves her ear. She told me, 'I feel God closer than ever before."

That more Rufumbira speakers will earnestly engage with God's Word.
