PRAYER UPDATES FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Pray that our 2-week Oral Bible Storytelling workshop in September will honor the Lord and equip participants to make Scripture known to many people in our language. Pray for our trainers as they prepare by learning the stories. Pray also for participants' safety as they travel, and wisdom and strength as they work.

IMPACT STORY

The Lamb Who Was Slain

A Briyani man called John was moved to tears when he read Isaiah 53 during an exegetical check.

Recently, a team member met with John and, after hearing about the impact the Scripture had on him, asked him to read Revelation 5. Moving from the sacrificial language in Isaiah to the image of Jesus as the slain Lamb in Revelation, John gained a deeper understanding of who Christ is: the Lion and the Lamb, Alpha and Omega.

Tears came to John's eyes once again. "When he reads about Jesus," the team member says, "his heart is being tugged, and it's evident—by his own words—that he greatly wants to know more about Jesus."

PRAY

That the Lord will grant John and others who read Briyani Scripture a full and saving knowledge of Him.



The Yeshua Al Noor team thanks God for helping them complete the book of Luke on schedule. However, "fear and insecurity have been escalating around us ... robbery and kidnapping became a daily routine around here, and we really need your prayers." Pray that God will bring peace to this team's country and community, and use the Gospel of Luke to reassure people of His steadfast love and care.

The Lord Provides for a Partner's Needs

One Eurasian partner organization has been managing the Geser project, which includes 2 local storytelling teams who were seeking help to audio record Bible stories. The Geser team asked us to pray for several needs in June to help move their project forward.

Praise God! He has been answering those prayers.

One need was to find a recording actor, since the translator's voice was not suitable. The Lord provided a woman who has helped with translation editing and recording, making it possible to conduct community testing more efficiently. God also supplied replacements for other people who unexpectedly backed out—an illustrator and a community tester.

PRAISE

For God's timely provision in answering our previous prayers.

PRAY

That the recording actor will efficiently finish re-recording stories that have already been translated.



A translation team reports that a third of the community members who were reviewing and testing translated Scripture are no longer available to help. Pray that the Lord will supply their desperate need for "someone really good at pointing out things that don't make sense or sound awkward. And 2 helpers would be even better."



Wednesday

PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT A Translator Finds Real Certainty and Truth

Moe grew up following religious methods and instructions passed down by his ancestors "as certainty and truth." But what he has learned as a translator changed his beliefs.

First, he says, he learned that people must love others. But "most importantly, it taught me how Jesus sacrificed His life for us and that—in exchange for these hardships, agonies, and pains—He does not ask anything of us.

"I am very thankful to the Lord Jesus, that He considered me worth all this and showed me the truth of life. I no longer have fear."

- That Moe will persevere in following his new certainty and truth in Christ.
- That Scripture will also change the hearts of others who are bound to ancestral beliefs.

Meeting a Major Need

These CiTs will play a major role in helping the Deaf of Eurasia receive God's Word in a language they can understand.

God Speaks Through a Single Verse

Awan translator Arhaz recently learned that even a single verse or sentence can touch a heart, even if that heart seems far away. As he read Psalm 34:18 (see above), he was impressed by how comfortingly near God seemed.

Later, he casually shared what happened with his unbelieving sister. "She didn't say much," he says. "She just listened."

A few days later, she called to say, "That sentence you said... I've still been thinking about it. Read it for me again so I can write it down."

Arhaz was amazed. God showed him something about how God encounters people, he says. "Translating the Bible is not just a personal task or a project."

That God's translated Word will communicate His closeness to each person who hears it.
