PRAYER UPDATES FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Our teams struggled for years with limited access to a translation consultant until a man from another country over 1,300 miles away agreed to relocate with his family to support our languages. Praise God for His amazing provision!

Praise God that our team resumed consultant checking on our project, which has been suspended since Covid. We are halfway through the book of Mark, the first Scripture portion for our community. Pray that we will continue to make speedy progress.

It has been so helpful that we gave it a Shanjo name, Mutusi, which means advocate or helper. Praise God for the many ways that He equips His people to bring about His purposes in Bible translation.

Islands Asia

Islands Asia includes just 3 countries, but there is a great concentration of need within these islands. Some areas have strong, vibrant churches, while others have very few, if any, known believers. Praise God that leaders in translation organizations, churches, and businesses alike are seeing Bible translation's importance in ministry. In addition to the logistical challenges of reaching certain remote islands, persecution is common in one country.

REGIONAL UPDATE

"AI Taste and See" Event Informs Partners

Field partners in the Islands Asia region are curious and eager to learn more about using artificial intelligence (AI) for drafting Scripture. Representatives from Seed Company's Field Technology and Islands Asia teams shared an overview of Scripture Forge during a recent online session with 80 participants from multiple Bible translation partners. They answered partners' questions and helped clear up misconceptions. Two partners from Indonesia shared their positive experiences with using Scripture Forge.

Participants provided positive feedback on the event, and some expressed a strong interest in using Al drafting in the future.

Kuada Community Welcomes Bible Stories

Amid many challenges, Kuada [KOO-AH'-DAH] team members relied on God's guidance and provision to accomplish their goal of crafting 24 oral Bible stories—the first Scripture their people have ever had in their language. They recently celebrated a special milestone as they hosted a dedication event to launch these stories in their community.

Kuada speakers received the stories with joy and are now listening to them and learning about God's redemptive love and plan for their lives.

PRAY

- That God will continue to use Kuada believers as they share Bible stories with their community.
- That the gospel message will penetrate animistic and Islamic barriers to draw nonbelievers to Jesus.



Praise God for the successful completion of the Maroho Cluster Workshop in September. New Testament teams (Edopa and Mabete) completed consultant checking of Acts 5–10 and drafted Acts 11–20. Old Testament teams (Ada, Ampiri, Hua, and Soba) accelerated their work by using Scripture Forge, while 3 missionary pastors from partner PPA/GMIM joined as team facilitators. Local churches generously provided meals and lodging. Please pray for all teams as they prepare texts for consultant review, including Leviticus, Ruth, 1–2 Kings, 1–2 Chronicles, and Acts 11–20.

They are at the forefront of innovation, seeking to bring God's Word to unreached people groups as quickly as possible. They creatively engage communities with Scripture as each project incorporates websites, apps, and social media groups to ensure easy access to God's Word.

PRAY FOR AN ACTIVE TRANSLATION PROJECT

New Scripture for the Timber Community

The Timber translation team and their churches are rejoicing over the release of a new print publication containing all 4 Gospels and the book of Acts! When including other books that are available in digital and audio formats, the Timber people now have access to 9 books of Scripture in their language. Praise God!

One pastor recently shared how deeply their community was moved by a sermon from Philippians that encouraged believers to "live for Christ" as Paul did, even amid hardship. Hearing and reading God's Word in their heart language has strengthened people's faith and unity.

PRAY

For courage, protection, and steadfast hope for the team. They face growing pressure from local authorities who have begun monitoring churches to discourage outside support.

Comparing Partners to Thriving Gardens

Not a Period, but a Comma

Weka speaker Hiro lived marginalized from society. He married a woman from a clan that—according to cultural tradition—shouldn't intermarry with his clan. Community members reported his marriage, and he was nearly thrown into jail.

People gave him such a hard time that he tried to take his own life. When he was at his very lowest, Hiro learned about the work of Bible translation and began translating Scripture into Weka.

"People don't think I'm worthwhile," he says. "Then why was I chosen by the Lord? The moment I thought my life was worthless and over [like a period ending a sentence]—it wasn't a period for the Lord. He said it was only a comma." Today, Hiro lives with his wife and child and has her family's blessing.

PRAY

For God's protection over Hiro as he works to make Scripture available for his community.



Recent eruptions of the Mount Lewotobi volcano have caused some villages to be evacuated and most flights in and out of the region to be canceled. This has caused disruptions for translation teams serving the 5 languages of the Lembata project. Pray for safety and wisdom for the teams as they navigate these challenges and translate Luke, Acts, and portions of Matthew.
